On the field: Land, a four-year starter, had a batting

average of .386 and was among the team leaders in every statistical category. Land tied for second on the team with eight home runs and had seven doubles, 27 RBIs and 32 runs.

Coach Trevor Howell's comments: "Austin was the piece that ran the entire system and the program here. He did everything that we asked and more to get ready for this season. He was our most consistent player this year and very rarely had an off day."

the Royals made the state 5-A playoffs and finished fourth in Region 1. On the mound, he was 5-0 with one save and one no-hitter (against Morgan). He also batted .367 with three home runs and 15 RBIs.

Coach Greg Patterson's comments: "Bubba was one of the best pitchers we have had here at Roy since I have been coaching here. He was such a big part of what we wanted to do, and we were a more confident team when he was pitching on the mound. He was also a threat offensively."

Cameron Clark

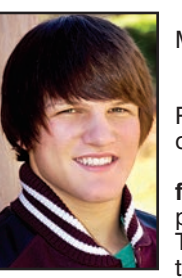


School: Clearfield

Dixon Marble

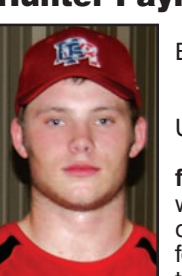


School: Bear River

Jared Taylor

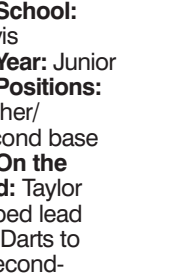


School: Davis
