Katie Taylor (MVP)



School: Davis
Year: Junior
Position: Right forward
On the pitch: A third-year starter for the Darts, Taylor led the team in both scoring and assists, amassing a school-record 68 points on 22 goals and 24 assists as Davis reached the state 5-A title game for the second time in school history.
Coach Soulihan Phongsavath's comments: "We asked Katie to not only score, but distribute this year. We wanted her to be the focal point of our attack. Most of our goals this season went through Katie one way or another."

Kendra Bailey


School: Davis
Year: Junior
Position: Central midfielder
On the pitch: A third-year starter for the Darts, Bailey tallied 12 assists and eight goals out of the midfield for Davis, which won its third consecutive Region 1 title.
Coach Soulihan Phongsavath's comments: "Kendra is our playmaker. She sees the game well with her great vision. She spread the ball around and got a lot of the other girls involved. Kendra's biggest tactical strength is her ability to read the game. Her biggest improvement this year was her ability to get into the attack."

Ivee Barton


School: St. Joseph
Year: Sophomore
Position: Central forward
On the pitch: A second-year starter for the Jayhawks, Barton scored a 2-A best-tying 25 goals, the second straight season she has led St. Joseph's in goals scored. She added 14 assists for St. Joseph, which finished 6-2 in Region 14 and outscored league foes 75-5.
Coach Alex Salvo's comments: "Ivee is a smart soccer player. She knows how to read what is going on on the field. She always knows where to be at the right time. She is very composed at the moment of scoring and that takes a special individual."

School: Morgan
Year: Senior
Position: Central defender
On the pitch: A fourth-year starter for the Trojans, Benson helped anchor a defense that posted six shutouts.
Coach Tara Ferrin's comments: "Heidi was a leader by example. Heidi played the entire year without an ACL, but she didn't let it stop her. She has the ability to control the ball out of the air and the footwork to provide the perfect pass. She was very good at reading the angles and learned to not step for the ball, but instead stop the player and let them make the mistake and give up the ball."

Chansi Crompton


School: Fremont
Year: Sophomore
Position: Central midfielder
On the pitch: A first-year starter for the Silver Wolves, Crompton led her team in scoring (12 goals) and assists (9), helping Fremont to a runner-up finish in Region 1 play (13-1-2 league).
Coach Sean Hill's comments: "The most important thing Chansi brought to our team was heart and passion. She always wanted to play, whether it was in a scrimmage or when she was sick and barely able to move. She brought us an ability to create mismatches all over the field."

Makensie Day


School: Clearfield
Year: Junior
Position: Central defender
On the pitch: A third-year starter for the Falcons, Day was a critical player on both ends of the field. She finished with three goals and three assists as the anchor of Clearfield's 3-4-3 formation.
Coach Joe Gallegos' comments: "Makensie was the anchor of our formation. Without her speed and aggressiveness, we wouldn't have been as competitive. She always brought her 'A' game. She was one of our team captains. She demonstrated her leadership by bringing the play of those around her up to her level."

School: Bonneville
Year: Junior
Position: Central midfielder
On the pitch: A second-year starter for the Lakers, Deeb tallied five assists and two goals while running the central midfield, helping Bonneville capture a school-record 15 wins.
Coach Lane Barker's comments: "Kami is the quarterback for us. She is a team player and captain who was composed and unselfish. She helps all the players around her become better. Her vision ability to find the open players was unmatched. She did an amazing job of getting all of the other players involved."

School: Davis
Year: Senior
Position: Central defender
On the pitch: A second-year starter, Eames was a critical part of a defense that posted 11 shutouts and finished 14-2-0 in Region 1 play. Going to Weber State, she had three goals and three assists.
Coach Soulihan Phongsavath's comments: "Bailey was our anchor defensively. She played her position perfectly. She has speed and power, but also reads the game well. She takes the perfect angle at attackers and rarely gets beat. Her position is a high-pressure position and she made it look easy."

School: Fremont
Year: Junior
Position: Central defender
On the pitch: A third-year starter, Hansen helped anchor a defense that produced seven shutouts. She finished with 10 goals and four assists for Fremont, which advanced to the semifinals of the state 5-A tournament.
Coach Sean Hill's comments: "Ryley was always going to work harder than the next person. When the season started this year, we weren't sure what to do with the backline. I approached her and asked if she was willing to give it a shot. She didn't even hesitate and she excelled in that role for us."

School: Fremont
Year: Sophomore
Position: Left forward
On the pitch: A second-year starter, Ivins tallied nine goals and four assists to help Fremont to a school-record 15 wins (15-2-2 overall).
Coach Sean Hill's comments: "The most important thing Taylor brought to our team was hard work. She expected a lot of herself and worked hard to try and achieve those things. Because of her speed, she always wanted the through ball or over the top so she could run on to it, but as the year progressed she became more and more dangerous coming back to receive the ball."

Year: Sophomore
Position: Central midfielder
On the pitch: A second-year starter for the Jayhawks, Matyjasik tallied a 2-A best-tying 25 goals and 20 assists in helping St. Joseph to a second-place finish in the state 2-A tournament and a 11-6-0 overall record.
Coach Alex Salvo's comments: "Joanna provides leadership by example. She is one of the hardest working individuals I have had. She is a skillful midfielder and will make the job easier for any forwards with her passing skills. She will only continue to improve as her career progresses."

Year: Junior
Position: Left forward
On the pitch: A second-year starter for the Lancers, Robison finished with a team-best 18 goals. She also tallied five assists for Layton, which finished third in Region 1 action and earned a berth in the state 5-A quarterfinals.
Coach Rick Talamantez's comments: "Jill brought a ton of intensity to the field. Her speed is very tough to match up with. Speed like hers allows you to get behind the defense quickly. She was able to do that a lot this year. She would get behind the defense fast and that put her in a position to score goals."

Position: Forward
On the pitch: A fourth-year starter, Sorter had a team-best 11 goals and led the team in assists, helping the Titans reach the state 5-A playoffs for the first time. She is verbally committed to Weber State.
Coach Bill Deleuw's comments: "The most important thing that Felicia brought to the team was her amazing work ethic. Not only did she come to every practice and game ready to give her all, but she also expected the rest of the team to do the same. These expectations made her a great leader on the team."

Year: Sophomore
Position: Central midfielder
On the pitch: A first-year starter, Swan finished with 12 goals and five assists in the attacking midfield for Davis, which finished with a school-record 17 wins.
Coach Soulihan Phongsavath's comments: "Sammi really stepped it up this year and was strong in the middle. We asked her not only to get back and help on defense, but to also get into the attack, to work with Kendra in the middle and help distribute the ball. She really has a knack for scoring the timely goal in crucial situations."

Position: Left forward
On the pitch: A second-year starter and third-year letterwinner, Thornock led the Lakers in scoring for the third consecutive year, finishing with a 4-A best 26 goals and five assists in helping to lead Bonneville to a 15-3-0 record.
Coach Lane Barker's comments: "Jaiden just has the ability to take over a game. She has explosive speed and will not be denied in the attacking third. Jaiden is able to take on two or three defenders at once and was still able to get around them. Jaiden single-handedly won some close games for us."

On the pitch: A third-year starter, Ulrich helped anchor a defense that posted five shutouts. Ulrich also tallied two goals and two assists for Bonneville, which captured the Region 5 title (9-1-0 league) and earned a berth in the state 4-A championship game.
Coach Lane Barker's comments: "Abby was one of our captains this year and she was a great decision-maker. She could see what was happening during a game and was able to figure out what needed to be done for us. She had a great ability to win the ball in the air."

Her biggest improvement this year was her ability to communicate and take charge in the back. She was the vocal leader of the defense. I was really impressed with her composure in the net."
